		Chair explained that the Forum were very happy to engage. AFU	
		could be considered for the expert group, so we could make informed decisions.	
		It was suggested that the Dept will engage with the Forum and look	
		for comments directly (rather than through the Working Group).	
		Q: The Original directive had appropriate treatment for anything	
		over 2000 p.e., good that it's being lowered to 1000 p.e., but what	
		about agglomerations of less than 1000 p.e.?	
		Looking for risk assessments, so plants get appropriate treatments	
		in the right place.	
		Q. Storm Water Overflows are a huge issue in Ireland. Glad to hear there is more focus on this in the recast directive – anything further	
		to say (we need to do something about it?)	
		There is a push for nature-based solutions, Recast looking at	
		monitoring every single flow which is practically not possible	
		(discussing modelling being allowed) – a lot of discussion still.	
		Q. Shouldn't sign up to something where we're going to miss the	
		targets on. Question of how many countries would struggle?	
		Denmark, Germany all have push back on this, there has to be	
		reality and balance.

		There is a derogation for countries in a transition zone e.g. for countries with new treatment plants that are not up to new	
		standard (Ireland can't avail of this)	
		Spain & France are also supporting risk-based assessments	
		Q. What is Ireland's position on extended polluter principle?  It's a good idea, just not sure how it will be managed. Profit margins in generics will be passed on to consumer.	
		Q. What's Irelands positions on septic tanks connecting to collection system?	
		Most people won't want to be required to connect their septic tanks to a collection system. Agree with risk-based approach – this could also be applied to the septic tank area.	
		Comment: We have to move to a holding tank situation, we have been laggers in relation to WWT, you are trying to defend the indefensible.	
		Q. What would be the level of price increase on Pharma and Personal care products, has a figure come up?	
		Impact assessment gave some figures, think it's very	
		underestimated. Comment: Forum supportive of risk-based approach.	
		Q. What is the timeline for engagement?	
		Timelines are really tight, have to have comments back by 19 <sup>th</sup> of	
		June – the sooner I can get your comments the better. 5th July and 20 <sup>th</sup> July other deadlines.

		The Chair was of the view that when the Forum receives the next draft of the Plan that we shouldn't be afraid of saying something at the appropriate time. If we think discussions with WPAC are not being effective, we can go to Minister.	
		The Chair explained that the Forum needs to look at what we get next and make a judgment about whether our recommendations	
		are being taken on board. If we are unhappy, we can just go straight to the Minister. We should work as a Forum to establish our views on the final plan.
